Our Residential and Outpatient Programs provide services for adults ages 18 and older who have acquired brain injuries. We are recognized as specialists in post-acute rehabilitation services. Over the past three decades, we have extended our continuum beyond post-acute residential rehabilitation to also include neurobehavioral rehabilitation, outpatient/day treatment services, supported living, and home and community services.

Our experienced and caring team of professionals help recovering clients and their families obtain a better quality of life. Each client participates in a comprehensive interdisciplinary evaluation at admission that serves as the basis for the development of an individualized care plan that establishes realistic and attainable goals.

Our treatment model includes clinical services from licensed therapists (physical, occupational, speech/language and recreational therapists, neuropsychologists, behavior analysts, nurses, medical specialists (physiatrists, neuropsychiatrists, etc.), case managers, nutritional/dietary services, and Life Skills Trainers or Behavior Technicians who are educated in issues specific to brain injury. Physician services, other than medical oversight by the Medical Directors and psychiatric consultants, are provided via referral. Skilled therapies are provided by licensed therapists employed by our organization. Therapies are provided at the level and intensity deemed appropriate by the care plan and/or physician orders. Extension therapies are developed by skilled therapists and are facilitated by Life Skills Trainers seven days a week. Services are designed to assist in recovery of functional ability and/or to develop the use of compensatory strategies by the individual and his or her support network to encourage maximal functional independence.

Residential services are provided 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Skilled therapies are generally provided Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Recreational and community integration opportunities are provided daily, including weekends. Day Treatment (outpatient) services are generally provided between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

We also provides rehabilitation services to individuals with Spinal Cord Injury (SCI). The causes of SCI most typically seen are occupational, sports and motor vehicle accidents. Typically injuries are C5 or lower. Both complete and incomplete breaks are considered for admission. A person with SCI and autonomic dysreflexia must be able to communicate adequate information to others regarding symptoms. Other co-occurring conditions accepted with SCI would include, but are not limited to, brain injury, urinary tract infections, pressure ulcers, depression, spasticity, heterotopic ossification, pulmonary emboli, and DVT.

While clients in our programs are generally required to be medically stable, all referrals are determined on a case-by-case basis depending upon level of need, local resources and state licensing regulations.

Referral sources include hospitals, acute rehabilitation programs, insurance companies, adjusters, case managers, individual providers, attorneys, family members, and governmental agencies.

Types of funding for services include worker's compensation insurance, health plans, private payment, liens, as well as veteran and state programs. We are not a Medicaid provider, but do accept Colorado Medicaid Waiver. Residential services and Day Treatment are based on per diems as determined by level of intensity of services and type of services needed. All fees are reviewed at least annually for each client and at the time of any change in program intensity or level of service.
